CLUBHOUSE INFORMATION

GUESTS

A member is responsible for any damage or debt incurred by any guests he or she brings to the Club. A guest is governed by the same golf rules and attire standards which a Player is governed.

DRESS CODE

The Purpose of the Dress Code is to ensure that sensible, reasonable and appropriate standards are maintained at all times on Club premises.

Golf attire should be neat, tailored and consistent with the standards of the Club and tradition of the game of golf.

It is unfair to the Directors, Golf Committee, Club staff, Pro Shop and Watson and Colt course starters, to be forced to deal with infractions even though they are authorized to do so.

It is the responsibility of every player to ensure that their family members and guests comply with the Dress Code at all times.

The Pro Shop is well stocked with suitable clothing and any inadvertent errors may be easily corrected.

DRESS CODE - MEN & JUNIOR BOYS

1. Golf shirts must have a collar or must be a recognized golf shirt design, e.g. mock turtle or turtleneck.
2. Shirts must be tucked into trousers.
3. Tailored trousers or shorts are required. The following are not permitted:
 - a) Rugby pants
 - b) Sweat pants
 - c) Cargo pants or shorts
 - d) Blue jeans or denim pants or shorts
4. Golf shorts are permitted provided that they are tailored and knee length (Bermuda length). Jamaica length and tennis shorts are not permitted.
5. With shorts, only the following socks are permitted and are available in the Pro Shop:
 - a) Proper knee length Bermuda socks with a turned down cuff
 - b) Ankle socks or sockettes
6. Closed toed sandals or deck shoes may be worn on the lawn with or without socks. Socks are required in the formal areas of the Clubhouse.

7. Hats must be worn with the peak facing frontward. Hats are not to be worn in the Clubhouse.
8. Any logos or advertising must be golf related.
9. Metal spiked golf shoes and golf sandals are not permitted.

Players and guests are required to change into golf attire in the Locker Room or Tee House.

DRESS CODE - WOMEN & JUNIOR GIRLS

1. Sleeveless tops are permitted provided they have a collar and conversely, any top worn without a collar must have sleeves. Tank, tube, crop and halter tops are not permitted.
2. Tops must be tucked in except those with banded bottoms.
3. Conservative tailored golf skirts, shorts or pants (including Capri-length) are appropriate. Short skirts or shorts (e.g. tennis length) are not permitted.
4. Jeans, cargo, rugby, sweat and spandex pants/shorts are not permitted.
5. Golf socks must be worn.
6. Caps and visors are not to be worn backwards.
7. Any logos or advertising must be golf related.
8. Metal spiked golf shoes and golf sandals are not permitted.

CLUBHOUSE ATTIRE

1. Golf attire may not be worn in the formal areas of the Club (Drawing Room, Dining Room and Trophy Room) after 6:00 p.m.
2. For private parties in the Dining Room and Trophy Room, men are required to wear a jacket.
3. All players are requested to inform their guests of the Club Dress Code.

ACCESS TO FACILITIES

Children and Junior Associates

Children and Junior Associates (age 10-18) are welcome throughout the main floor of the Clubhouse. Female Junior Associates are permitted to use the women's locker room on the second floor. Children under the age of 10, while in the Clubhouse or on the lawn area, must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

BUSINESS CENTRE

The Business Centre is located on the second floor of the Clubhouse adjacent to the Annex. The Business Centre facilities include full wireless access, two computer workstations, printers, telephones and a small meeting table for your convenience. The Business Centre is open seven days a week during regular Clubhouse hours.

RESTRICTION OF BRIEFCASES, BUSINESS PAPERS

Under no circumstances are briefcases to be taken into the Club's social rooms or should business papers be displayed in these areas. This restriction also applies to the golf courses - both the 18 hole course, the 9 hole course and the practice area.

This restriction does not apply to business meetings for which prior arrangements have been made nor does it apply to the Business Centre.

WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES (WCD)

1. While on Club property, all WCDs are to be switched to silent mode (no ringing, beeping or vibrating).
2. Talking on a cell phone is prohibited on the golf courses, in the Clubhouse and on the property in general, other than in a vehicle in the parking lot, in a designated phone booth or in the Business Centre.
3. Silent, non-audible use of WCDs is permitted in the following areas, but must be discreet and non-disruptive to others:
 - Locker rooms
 - Pro Shop
 - Second and third floors of the Clubhouse (other than in the Men's TV Room, Men's Balcony, Women's Scoring Room and Women's TV Room)
 - Learning Centre
 - The Tee House at the practice area
 - Parking lots
 - The Business Centre

For clarity, use of WCDs is not permitted on the main floor of the Clubhouse (including the Lawn and other areas where players and their guests are enjoying food and beverage service), other than in the Men's locker room or rooms that have been booked for meetings.

4. Provided proper golf course etiquette is observed and pace of play is not affected, silent, non-audible use of WCDs is permitted on the golf courses only on tee boxes if you are waiting for the group in front to clear. Any use of WCDs on the golf courses outside of the

tee boxes or in any manner that slows down the pace of play will not be tolerated. Players are encouraged to carry their WCDs in silent mode for use in emergency situations on the golf courses. The use of WCDs as GPS measuring devices is permitted as long as the WCDs are not used for other purposes not permitted by this policy.

Players are responsible for ensuring that their guests are aware of, and comply with, all Club policies.
